

Proposed Revisions to the Bylaws

Article 3, Section 2, EQUITY SLIP RIGHTS MEMBERSHIP. On owner and spouse of as owner and other co-owner(s) of a sailboat and holder(s) of slip rights shall be entitled to the full privileges of membership in the Club, upon payment of required dues, fees, and assessments **and submission of proof of boater's liability insurance (\$100,000 minimum) with inclusion of PYC as named additional insured** as outlined in the Bylaws. A husband and wife and other co-owner(s) shall be considered as one dues paying unit. Each shall be a member but only one vote may be exercised at regular or special meetings of the Club. Equity slip rights members are eligible to hold any office within the Club.

Article 3, Section 3, LEASED SLIP RIGHTS MEMBERSHIP. An annually renewable membership for an owner and spouse of an owner and other co-owner(s) of a sailboat. Membership includes the right to use the facilities of the Club and the right to use of a slip. Membership in the Club is conditional based on application for the same, acceptance into the Club, and payment of required **dues**, fees, and assessments **and submission of proof of boater's liability insurance (\$100,000 minimum) with inclusion of PYC as named additional insured** as outlined in the Bylaws. A husband and wife and other co-owner(s) shall be considered as one dues paying unit. Each shall be a member but only one vote may be exercised at regular or special meetings of the Club. Leased slip rights members are eligible to hold any office within the Club.

Article 3, Section 4, DRY SAIL MEMBERSHIP. An annually renewable membership for **an** owner and spouse of an owner and other co-owner(s) of a trailerable sailboat. Membership includes the right to use the facilities of the Club but not the right to use of a slip. Membership in the Club is conditional based on application for the same, acceptance into the Club, and payment of required dues, fees, and assessments **and submission of proof of boater's liability insurance (\$100,000 minimum) with inclusion of PYC as named additional insured** as outlined in the Bylaws. A husband and wife and/or unrelated co-owner(s) shall be considered as one dues paying unit. Each shall be a member but only one vote may be exercised at regular or special meetings of the Club. Dry Sail members are eligible to hold any office within the Club.

Article 3, Section 8, RACING MEMBERSHIP. An annually renewable individual membership for members who harbor their boats at other Perry Lake marinas but want to race and do not want to participate in other Club activities. Membership includes the right to use the facilities of the Club but not the right to the use of a slip, mooring or boat ramp. Each participating member shall pay dues. Membership in the Club is conditional based on application for the same, acceptance into the Club, and payment of required dues **and submission of proof of boater's liability insurance (\$100,000 minimum) with inclusion of PYC as named additional insured** as outlined in the Bylaws. Racing members may not hold office, serve on the

Board of Governors, or vote at regular or special meetings of the Club. Racing members may serve on appointed committees.

Article 5, MEMBERSHIP DUES AND FEES, Section 1. The annual dues for various membership categories shall be recommended by the Board of Governors and approved by a majority of the members voting at the fall annual **meeting** of the Club. Any increase in annual dues will be reflected in the subsequent dues billing.

Proposed Revisions to the Policies

Section 7. Board of Governors, A7, Director of Communications.

Section 7, Board of Governors, B2d, Director of Communications.

Section 7, Board of Governors, D, The Director of Buildings and Grounds shall have charge of constructing, repairing, and maintaining all buildings, roads, and structures owned or maintained by the Club. All such duties shall be performed as directed by the Commodore or the Board of Governors. The Buildings and Grounds Director has control of all land areas of the Club, including but not limited to roads, parking, camping areas, and boat and trailed storage. **The Director of Buildings and Grounds shall be in charge of the tools and machinery owned by Perry Yacht Club and provide a method of checking them out to responsible members.** The Buildings and Grounds Director shall ascertain that all permits, licenses, insurance and regulations by the Corps of Engineers, county, and state are properly obtained and abided by.

Section 7, Board of Governors, J, The Director of Communications shall have charge of all communications to Club members, including publication of the official Club newsletter, official notice of general or called meetings as directed by the Secretary, maintenance of the Club's official web page, and publication of such other news and articles as prescribed by the Secretary, any officer and members of the Board.

Section 8B, Race Committee, 5, The Committee is hereby given the authority to call hearings on any violation and to disqualify any contestant found guilty of violation of any racing rule of an appointed Protest Committee **be** so vested.

Section 8D, Long Range Planning Committee

- 1. The Long Range Planning Committee shall consist of the Commodore, Past Commodore, and Vice Commodore and any other members appointed by the Commodore.**
- 2. It shall poll the membership to ascertain their interests for near and long term projects, developments, and courses of direction and develop a running plan out to five years to include priority and estimated financial impact.**

Section 9, Advisory Officers

A. Corps of Engineers Liaison

- 1. The Corps of Engineers Liaison shall act as Club spokes person to the Corps of Engineers.**

B. Public Affairs Liaison

1. The Public Affairs Liaison shall stay abreast of laws and regulations affecting membership in the Club and the Club's activities on the lake, and shall represent the Club at public meetings where the interests of the Club should be expressed.
