We're excited to share that the paperwork for the new dock wave attenuator has been finalized, and the down payment has

been made. We're officially on the manufacturer's list, and installation is expected before the lake ices over this fall.

Facility improvements are also underway. Volunteers has installed a new ceiling and ventilation in the bathrooms which are helping to keep them cooler than the outside temperatures. Volunteers have installed the window AC unit in the kitchen, which should be more effective now that the kitchen has a properly insulated ceiling. Volunteers have finished a new stairway to the lower lot.

Members have been hard at work removing boats belonging to owners who are behind on payments. One boat has already been auctioned, and preparations are underway for the next auction.

Thanks to a volunteer are are also pleased to announce that PYC now has internet service through Starlink! This new service is available for all members to use and is accessible at the clubhouse. The switch to Starlink has already improved the performance of our weather station and camera links.

Additional improvements include gravel leveling on the RV parking spots and successful repairs to the RC boat, which is now running more smoothly. New dock lines have been installed on the RC boat, the work boat, and the skiff.

Did you forget the gate code? Well, it's easy to find on your membership card. This year's code is now active; past years won't work.

Our recent work day was a great success, with members completing numerous projects: replacing dock boards on Sunset, cleaning and organizing the storage units and surrounding areas, tidying up the kitchen, clearing brush around the grounds, and more.

The Board of Governors (BOG) has passed updated policies, which will be published on the website soon. Additionally, our club banking has transitioned to Farmers Bank & Trust, which will offer significantly improved retail banking services.



This is a reminder that if you sell a boat, it's your responsibility to notify the state of KS that the boat has been sold and who it was sold to. There are important liability reasons for this. Equally important, if you are a club member acquiring a different or additional boat, it's very important that you notify members@perryyachtclub.com of your new boat so we can update our records, link the boat to your membership, and record your storage location. When renewing it is important that you provide the club with your boat information.

Legally, you should also register your new boat with the state, but that's your choice.



On a more positive note, please join me in welcoming our newest members. Mark Lodes and Jennifer Lamb recently joined the club and purchased the Starwind 27 from a former member. They are docked in Rodeo 3. Sailing lessons at PYC with Paramour Sailing School

This month, we are highlighting our "how to get started' sailing classes. For sailors who want another trained sailor on board for safety or to share the skipper role, these classes are a great option. Also, if you have friends interested in learning to sail, here's how:

Zero to Hero

We have developed an immersion class called Zero to Hero. This four-day class will take beginners or novice sailors through the basic skills, helping them learn the language of sailing, handle the boat, manage various weather conditions, and ultimately, recover someone who goes overboard—making them a hero. This program covers all the skills and knowledge required for the ASA 101 Keelboat 1 Certification.

One Day Intro to Sailing

Our Intro to Sailing class for beginners is a great way to start learning. This one-day class introduces students to how sails work with the wind to move the boat and even the magic of sailing upwind! It combines classroom instruction with on-board skill-building.
