



· Pull and store Hobie Waves and Sunfish


- · Store racing gear

# Board proposal for small annual dues increase

The PYC board is proposing that dues automatically increase three percent every year, rounded down to the nearest dollar, starting with the 2026 membership year. The members will **vote on this proposal at the October 25 membership meeting**. Dues means and includes basic membership dues, summer and winter slip fees and summer and winter dry storage fees. This automatic increase can be changed in the future based upon a recomendation of the board to the membership, and a vote of the membership.
