Please be careful when fueling any club motor: some outboards are two-stroke, while the new one is four-stroke, and using the wrong fuel could damage the engine.

Finally, please mark your calendar for **Work Day and the Annual Meeting on October 25**. This is always a great chance to contribute, connect with other members, and enjoy a good lunch together.

#### **CLEAR THE PARKING LOT!**

The lower parking lot must be clear of all cars and boats when the new breakwater is being delivered and installed. Please do not pull your boat and park it in the lower parking lot until the new breakwater installation is complete. We will send out an announcement when we know the exact delivery date; we anticipate it will be sometime in late September or early October. Additionally, the lower lot will be blocked off during delivery and installation. Thanks for your cooperation.


## Harbor Updates
